If you are not a member of your Union, you should fill out the Application and give it to your Union Representative in your Department, or you can mail it to the Union Hall, 594 1st Street, West Palm Beach FL 33413, right away. If you are a member of your Union, give the application to a non-member and have them fill it out and get it back to the union. If you get a non-member to join the Union and you sign the attest part of the application, we will give you \$25.00 for signing them up.

If you send in your Application for Membership and you have never been a member of CWA Local 3181, **you will get two (2) months, dues FREE!** So, we are looking forward to having you as a member of CWA Local 3181. By doing so, you will be making your Union stronger at the bargaining table, the workplace and your community. Right To Join The Union

- 1. You can join the Union from the first day you are hired in a permanent full-time or part-time position with your employer (excluding the Village of Tequesta part-time workers)
- 2. **You can** have co-workers sign a membership application before work, during your breaks or lunch or after work only.

Do Members get the Same Benefits as Non-Members? NO!

Member

- Input into Contract Negotiations
- 2. Union Representation for on the job problems
- 3. Union pays for & Handles Members grievances
- 4. The more members we have, the better the Contract
- 5. Get an array of Member only benefits

Non-Member

- 1. No input into Contract Negotiations
- 2. Must handle their own problems
- 3. Must handle & pay for their own grievances
- 4. If we have a 50% membership, we get a 50% Contract.
- 5. Do not get these benefits



Union Representation

- The Union represents you if you have a grievance.
- If you are not a Union Member, you DO NOT have a right to Union Representation.



How Much are Union Dues?

- Union Dues are 2 hours of your pay per month, if you are scheduled to work 40 hours per week.
- If you are scheduled to work part-time, or less than 40 hours per week, your dues are prorated. Example: if you are scheduled to work, part-time, 20 hours per week, your dues are 1 hour of your pay per month.



What Are Union Dues Used For?

- Negotiations of Contracts
- Mobilization of Members & the Public
- Enforcement of Contracts & handling of grievances
- Educational Programs & Publications
- Research on employer's benefit plans & Finances
- Lobbying for legislation that affect Labor Issues
- Organizing
- Public relations
- Union Labor Attorneys
